Week 1: Why Did Jesus Come?

Big Idea: Our God is a missional God. When humans fell into sin, He made it His mission to save them.

God is a Missional God.

Read Genesis 3:1-6, 15, 21

Jesus calls us.

Week 2: What is Discipleship?

Big Idea: True discipleship is not what the rabbis did nor what the present day church often does. True discipleship is a radical lifestyle that focuses on following Christ and training others to follow Christ.

WHAT IS DISCIPLESHIP NOT?

What the rabbis did --

Read Matthew 23:13-15

WHAT IS TRUE DISCIPLESHIP?

Discipleship is not – A class, a seminar, a quick process, a suggestion.

Definition: "A lifelong journey and commitment of being a follower of Jesus and coming alongside a few selected people so that they become disciple makers in Jesus' likeness, empowered by the Holy Spirit" (Dr. David Kim)

Week 3: How Did Jesus Disciple?

Big Idea: Being a disciple of Jesus means being transformed in every way – head, heart, hands, and habits. Being a disciple is much more than simply knowing some facts about what you believe.

HOLISTICALLY - THE 4 H'S

Read 2 Timothy 3:14-17

Head

Understanding Christ centered theology and the mission of God is essential to following Jesus.

The 5 Solas – The 5 great "Solas", or "Alones" illustrate how we are saved: 1) By Christ Alone, 2) By Grace Alone, 3) Through Faith Alone, 4) Revealed in Scripture Alone, and 5) for the Glory of God Alone.

Read Ephesians 2:8-9

01. How are we saved? How does that reflect the 5 Solas?

Law and Gospel - The Law Shows us our sin, the Gospel shows us our Savior.

Read Romans 3:23-24

02. What do these verses tell you about the problem we have with God and His solution to our problem?

03. How are these principles central to our faith?

Heart

The heart focuses on the passion, values, call, motivation, and purpose of following Jesus.

The 6 C's – illustrate Christ's call to mission. They are: 1) The Great Confession – "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16); 2) The Great Commandment – "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, and mind.... Love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 22:37-40); 3) The Great Commission – "Make disciples of all nations by going, baptizing, training" (Matthew 28:18-20); 4) The Great Commitment – "If anyone would come after Me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow Me" (Luke 9:23); 5) The Great Celebration – "The great multitude that no one could number from every nation and tribe and people and language" (Revelation 7:9-10); 6) The Great Collaboration – "That they may all be one that the world may believe that You have sent Me" (John 17:20-23)

Read Luke 5:1-11

04. Which of the 6 C's are illustrated by this story?

Hands

Following Jesus means using our talents, skills, and spiritual gifts for the mission.

Read Ephesians 2:10

05. What does God expect us to do after we are saved?

Habits

Our habits are to reflect our character, behavior, and lifestyle patterns in following Jesus.

Read Romans 12:1-2

06. How are we to present ourselves to God? How are we to be transformed from our old way of life?

Training and Sending.

Read Luke 10:1-12

07. How does Jesus send out the 72?

From Showing to Doing.

Read Acts 1:8

08. As Jesus is leaving what does He tell His disciples they will do?

Reflection Questions:

09. What area do you need to improve the most in following Jesus? Head? Heart? Hands? Habits?

10. Has anyone ever offered to disciple you? Do you need a discipler?

Week 4: What Does A Disciple Look Like?

Big Idea: If you are going to follow Jesus and train others to follow Jesus there are certain qualities that God must instill in you. These qualities are not nearly as much about skills as they are about character.

8 QUALITIES OF A DISCIPLE MAKER

1) Spiritually Broken

Read Matthew 5:3

3) Teachable

6) Loyal

06. How should loyal disciples train up others to follow Jesus?

7) Able to Teach Others

8) Perseverant

Read Philippians 3:7-11



Week 5: What are the Obstacles to Evangelism and Discipleship?

Big Idea: The devil would like to keep believers from witnessing and making disciples. This section looks at some of the ways this happens and how to overcome these obstacles.

Spiritual Warfare

Read Ephesians 6:10-20

01. What does the disciple fight against and what are the parts of their armor?

Types of Obstacles

Here are some of the outward obstacles in the church to following the Great Commission:

- Christians have no sense of urgency to reach lost people.
- Church membership today is more about getting my needs met rather than reaching the lost.
- Churches have lost their focus on making disciples who will thus be equipped and motivated to reach the lost.
- Our churches have too many activities, they are too busy to do the things that really matter.

Here are some of the internal obstacles to following the Great Commission:

- 1) False beliefs; 2) Feelings of inadequacy; 3) Temptations and distractions; 4) Bitterness and unforgiveness; 5) Pride and rebellion;
- 6) Addictions of all types including sexual, drug, alcohol, and technology; 7) Woundedness and shame.

Read Luke 14:17-20 and John 6:66.


